

Canadian Lacrosse Tourney Planned for Winnipeg, Sept. 9-10

Victoria, Calgary and Toronto
Teams Likely to Play
Here

AN effort will be made during the visit of the Prince of Wales to Winnipeg, Sept. 9 and 10, to give lacrosse a Dominion-wide boost. The Winnipeg Lacrosse Association held a meeting Monday and whipped matters into shape for the holding of a Canadian Amateur Lacrosse Championship Tournament in Winnipeg. It is proposed to have teams from Victoria, Calgary, Toronto and Winnipeg take part in the competition. Victoria and Calgary have already sent notice that they would be here and it is expected that Toronto will fall in line.

This proposed tournament will settle the long drawn out dispute as to where the Mann cup, emblematic of the Canadian Amateur Lacrosse championship, belongs. Joe Lally ruled, several years ago, that Calgary had won the trophy by default, but Pacific coast leaguers have always been looked upon as the real champions. With teams from those leagues figuring in the tournament the argument can be settled.

This tournament will mark the first time that an eastern or

western lacrosse team has ever played here in a championship event. The competition should prove a great drawing card and should help materially to revive the national sport which has been on the wane for several years.

Local officials hope to have the Prince of Wales face off the ball in the first match.
